Shall be sponsored by a civic organization in Jackson County.


The Queen, first runner-up, second runner-up, and Ms. Congeniality will serve as official hostesses for opening ceremonies each evening in front of the grandstand.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Jackson County Fair Association will be following recommended procedures of the Jackson County Health Department for public safety. We ask all attendees to follow those procedures for the safety of fair attendees.

- **G1.** Display space may be leased to individuals, firms, and or organizations acceptable to the Board of Directors of the lessor. No subletting will be permitted.
- G2.All industrial buildings and outside exhibits will be open for exhibition from 1:00PM to 10:00PM, Monday through Saturday of fair week. In no case will trucks or other removal equipment be allowed in exhibit areas during "Open for exhibition" hours. Watchmen will be on duty.
- G3. All exhibitors, livestock, article, business or organization, shall conduct their operations in a manner that will not interfere with other exhibitors. Violation of this provision will result in the forfeit of all privileges, premium money or rental money and the removal of all effects from the lessor's grounds. All electrical extension cords must be 3-pronged and exhibit the Underwriters Laboratory "UL" on each cord used. Direct hook up to box.
- **G4.** The (lessor) will carefully preserve articles while on fair property, but will not be responsible for losses or accidents of such.
- **G5.** No exhibitor will be allowed to personally have access to the books of the Secretary during the fair. However, upon proper application, such explanations as are necessary will be made by the secretary.
- **G6.** Any person making willful misrepresentations shall forfeit all rights to any premium on an exhibit.
- G7. Any exhibitor, livestock, article, business or organization who exhibits/uses disrespectful language or manner to any member of this association shall forfeit all privileges, premium money or rental money and are required to immediately remove all effects from the lessor's grounds.
- **G8.** This premium book lists the classification of all premiums offered by the Fair Association and in no case will special classes be established for articles or animals in addition to those listed herein.
- **G9**. Due to the special nature of the ribbons and banners awarded, there will be NO replacement for either should the original be lost or destroyed.
- **G10.** The Fair Association reserves the right to postpone or change the time of exhibition of any animal or article.
- **G11.** No gambling devices, raffles, or selling of chances will be permitted on or in fair property.
- **G12.** No loudspeakers or special (unauthorized) entertainment will be permitted on or in fair property.
- G13. Advertising, canvassing or soliciting, and dissemination of written material, for political, commercial, educational, or religious purposes is permitted by an exhibitor who rents space during the duration of the fair. Dissemination of materials is limited to the frontage of the rented exhibit space. There shall be no solicitation of funds. Parking, ingress, egress and travel lanes shall not be obstructed. Interference with the traffic flow, either foot or vehicles, or with the duties prescribed for the traffic and/or parking attendants is prohibited. No flyers or printed materials is allowed to be left on or attached to vehicles in the parking areas.
- **G14.** A member of the executive committee will be at the fair office each day of the fair to hear and decide disputes or grievances affecting the fair and to rule upon the violations of the rules and regulations state herein.

Department Rules and Regulations

- **D1.** Entry and release dates for Family Arts, Horticulture, Farm Bureau, 4-H, FFA, and Antique Farm Display are found in the respective department's listings in this catalog.
- **D2.** Removal of articles in any of these departments prior to the designated time forfeits premiums on it.
- D3. All articles competing for premiums must possess more than ordinary merit, otherwise, no premium will be awarded. Unless there are two or more exhibitors in each class it shall be considered as if no competition exists. In such cases, first premium ribbon will be awarded at the judge's discretion and second premium money will be awarded.
- D4. All awards shall be made by the single judge system.
- D5. Other rules and regulations pertaining specifically to certain departments are listed under their headings herein.

LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

L1. Entry and Release Dates

Open Class beef cattle entries will be accepted from 8-10 A.M., **Sunday, July 23.** Cattle must be in place by 10 A.M. The open class beef cattle will be released at the end of the steer show. **4-H Cattle not entered in the open class show will be asked not to enter until after 8 P.M. on Sunday, July 23.**

Swine penned by 7 A.M. on **Monday** of fair week.

Open class sheep released after show.

Open class dairy cattle must be entered by noon on Monday of fair week.

All non-auction 4-H Livestock (Beef, Dairy Goats, Sheep and Swine) will be released after 11:00 P.M. Friday and must be removed prior to 8 A.M., **Saturday, July 29.**

L2. Removal of any livestock entries prior to the designated time forfeits premiums of it.

L3. Open Class, Entry Fees, and Event Fees

Beef Cattle \$20 per entry Dairy Cattle \$5 per entry \$10 per animal Sheep MRT. Barrow \$10 per animal \$10 Gilt Swine **Boer Goats** \$20 per head Pen fee \$5 \$2 Dogs

- **L4.** All tie-in, pen and entry fees are payable in advance to taking possession of the space allotted or upon delivery of entry tag with the Fair Association.
- L5. All requests for stalls will receive prompt attention and will be held for responsible parties until 4 P.M. on Monday of Fair week if payment has been made by 4 P.M.
- **L6.** All livestock competing for premiums must possess more than ordinary merit otherwise no premium will be awarded. Unless there are two or more animals in each class it shall be considered that no competition exist and in such cases first premium ribbon or tag and second premium money will be awarded.
- L7. Judging on animals will have regard to symmetry early maturity, size and general qualities, and characteristics of the breeds, which they judge. They will make due allowances for age, feeding and other circumstances and the character and condition of the animal.
- **L8.** All awards shall be made by the single judge system.
- **L9.** All animals to compete for premiums must be owned by the exhibitor at least thirty days prior to the exhibition.
- L10. All animals must be shown to receive ribbons or premiums.
- L11. All premium money will be withheld until tie-in, pen, and entry fees are
- L12. Livestock trucks and trailers must be parked in the parking areas South on Pyoca Road, 100S.

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION OF DOMESTIC ANIMALS IN INDIANA

2023

This document describes the Indiana State Board of Animal Health's (BOAH) requirements for all animal exhibitions in the state. However, exhibition organizers may impose additional requirements as a condition of exhibition. BOAH recommends contacting the exhibition organizer for specific information about requirements for each event.

Please call the Indiana State Board of Animal at (317) 544-2400 with questions concerning exhibition requirements in Indiana.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL SPECIES

A. Limitations on Exhibition

This section describes limitations on exhibiting animals in Indiana. Other exhibition limitations may be described in the species-specific requirements that follow.

- Failure to meet all animal health requirements will result in removal of animals from the exhibition premises.
 - 2. The following animals are not eligible for exhibition in Indiana:
 - a. Animals that originate from a herd that is under quarantine.
 - b. An animal prohibited from exhibition under any law or order.
 - c. Any animal classified as a brucellosis "suspect".
 - d. Animals showing signs of any infectious or communicable disease or that are a health hazard to people or other animals.
 - e. Any animal that does not meet state animal health requirements.
- 3. Any animal that develops or shows signs of any infectious or communicable disease during exhibition must be removed from the premises, including the surrounding exhibition grounds. An owner who is disputing the exclusion of his/her animal(s) from exhibition may not exhibit the animal in question pending any appeal.
- 4. The State Veterinarian is authorized to make the final determination as to an animal's eligibility for exhibition. The state veterinarian may order removal of any animal from the exhibition grounds.
- 5. Exhibition organizers may impose health requirements in addition to those prescribed by BOAH. Added requirements may not contradict requirements imposed by BOAH.
- 6. Exhibition organizers may have a licensed and accredited veterinarian review animals and animal health documentation during the exhibition.

B. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection

- 1. For animals that originate within Indiana, a certificate of veterinary inspection (commonly known as a "health paper") is not required by BOAH for exhibition. Contact the exhibition organizer to determine if a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) is necessary to meet the organizers exhibition requirements.
- 2. For animals that originate <u>outside</u> of Indiana, the exhibitor must have a properly completed CVI for all animals prior to entry. This requirement applies to all domestic animals (except fish and poultry).
 - a. CVIs must be completed by a licensed and accredited veterinarian who has personally inspected the animals.
 - b. A CVI for any animal is valid for 30 days from the date it is issued by a licensed and accredited veterinarian. NOTE: Animal(s) must be inspected by a licensed and accredited veterinarian no more than ten days prior to the date in which the CVI is issued.
 - c. CVIs must clearly include a description of each animal including the age, sex, and breed of the animal, and the official individual identification.
 - d. CVIs must accompany the animal while on the exhibition premises.

C. Pre-Entry Movement Permit (REVISED)- Effective January 1, 2022:

- 1. For swine and cattle that originate within of Indiana, a pre-entry movement permit is not required.
- **2. For swine and cattle that originate <u>outside</u> of Indiana**, a pre-entry movement permit is <u>not required</u> when an <u>electronic</u> certificate of veterinary inspection is issued.
- 3. For swine and cattle originating <u>outside</u> of Indiana, a pre-entry movement permit <u>is required</u> when a <u>paper</u> certificate of veterinary inspection is issued.
 - a. The 2022 Indiana State Fair pre-entry movement permit number is "INSF22" and must be noted on all <u>paper</u> certificates of veterinary inspection.
 - b. The 2022 National Swine Registry Open and Junior Exposition pre-entry movement permit number is "EXP22" and must be noted on the <u>paper</u> certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 4. For farmed cervids that originate <u>outside</u> of Indiana, a BOAH approved pre-entry movement permit number must be noted on the certificate of veterinary inspection. Permit applications are available online at: www.in.gov/boah/species information/cervids-deer-elk/
 - a. The pre-entry movement permit application must be received by BOAH at least 5 business days before moving into Indiana.
 - b. The Indiana State Board of Animal Health must authorize any proposed movements <u>prior</u> to entry into the State.

D. Indiana State Fairgrounds

- 1. The Federal Premises Identification Number for the Indiana State Fairgrounds that should be recorded on all associated CVIs is: 00C6T69
- 2. The physical address for the Indiana State Fairgrounds that should be recorded on all associated CVIs is: 1202 E 38th St. Indianapolis, IN 46205

E. Identification

All exhibition animals must be permanently and individually identified unless otherwise noted. Official ear tags are tags approved by the USDA that bear the US shield. All official identification and any additional identification devices should be recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

F. Testing

- 1. All tests required for exhibition must be conducted at the Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory (ADDL) at Purdue University, a laboratory approved by the Indiana State Board of Animal Health, or a state or federal-approved laboratory.
- 2. All animals, including Indiana animals, that are to be offered for sale to out of state buyers should have the necessary testing completed prior to the sale date. The destination state should be contacted to ensure all pre-entry movement requirements are met prior to the planned movement.

- c. Official USDA Program tags
 - Orange calfhood vaccination tags, with US shield
- 3. Testing
 - a. Cattle that originate within Indiana do not need a brucellosis test or a tuberculosis test for exhibition in Indiana.
 - **b. Cattle that originate outside of Indiana** do not need a brucellosis test or a tuberculosis test for exhibition in Indiana as long as the state of origin is classified as brucellosis free **AND** tuberculosis free by the USDA.
 - Cattle from states that are NOT designated as free by the USDA must meet additional requirements for entry into Indiana. Contact the Indiana State Board of Animal Health for specific information.

 - Originate from a herd that is accredited under a state tuberculosis accreditation program. 345 IAC 2.5-5-4.
 - From a herd that meets other herd testing standard described in 345 IAC 2.5-5-3(1).
- **b. Farmed cervids that originate <u>within</u> Indiana,** that are from a species known to be susceptible to chronic wasting disease (CWD), that are to be exhibited in Indiana must originate from a Certified CWD program herd defined under Indiana requirements 345 IAC 2-7-4.
- c. Farmed cervids that originate <u>outside</u> of Indiana must be from a CWD non-susceptible species (i.e. fallow deer) <u>AND</u> meet one of the following requirements as outlined in 345 IAC 1-3-29:
 - Originate from a tuberculosis free accredited herd.
 - Have two tuberculosis tests, 90 days apart, with the last test within 90 days of entry to Indiana.





If your animal has less than ½" of hair and causes a stoppage in production at the buyers facility, the buyer has the option to withhold payment on that animal. In that situation, the 4-Her will forfeit all market proceeds for that animal.
- 2. Classes to be posted the night before the show. All changes must be reported to Terry Melloncamp or Mark Wischmeier by 10:00 a.m. the day of the show.
- 3. All 4-H auction and out hogs not being taken home for personal use or going to the State Fair will be loaded out following the auction on Saturday, July 29. All out hogs not being sold on the auction but going to the locker for personal use will be loaded out beginning 7:00 AM on Friday, July 28. All hogs purchased on the auction and being sent to the locker will be loaded out following the auction. Any 4-H swine being taken home for breeding purposes or to be shown at the State Fair can be loaded out beginning 7:00 a.m. on Friday, July 28. Hogs going home for breeding purposes or to be shown at the State Fair could be dismissed earlier in the week depending on weather or other conditions. Early dismissal will be at the discretion of the livestock superintends.
- 4. No hog will be allowed to leave the fairgrounds and return later in the week to participate in the livestock

auction or loaded on the out hog trailer.

- 5. Pictures of 4-H auction hogs will be taken between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. Wednesday, July 26. At the time the pictures are taken all 4-Hers MUST know the destination of all non-auction hogs and report this to Lou Ann Hoevener.
